
Role Expectations

The below diagram represents the different relationships one may encounter:

Family– Key place where we learn about relationships

Friends– These relationships have a balance of power, status and resources

Youth Assistant– youth leader who helps in Church/School ministries/activities. *Remember that while volunteering as a youth assistant, you need to remain in this role with it's expectations even though you may have friends in the ministry/activities.*



What an Adult Leader Can Expect of Youth Assistants

- Respectful behavior
- Active participation in prayer and worship experiences
- Follow instructions
- Good listening skills
- Include everyone in activities
- Use appropriate language:
 - No name calling
 - Profanities
 - Put downs
- No practical jokes or humiliation
- All relationships need to remain in the youth assistant role during the time one is in this role
- Model program guidelines set by adults, i.e. sufficient sleep, healthy eating, etc.
- Confidentiality

History of Safe Environment Programs in The US Catholic Church Since 2002

All U.S. dioceses have been mandated to provide:

- *Victim assistance programs*
- *Safe environment policies*
- *Safe environment trainings for adults, children and youth*

Youth Assistant Role Expectations

- Must have completed the 6th grade
- Ability to follow program guidelines set by Adults.
- Positive role model with strong leadership skills
- Interest and availability for working with youth
- Enthusiasm
- Lives out their faith
- Ability to follow instructions
- Strong communication skills

What a Youth Assistant Can Expect of Adult Leaders

- An outline of your program responsibilities, expectations and how you will be supervised
- Communication with your parents regarding your leadership role and responsibilities
- Never to be left alone to supervise children/youth

Ministry Roles Defined...

Adult Ministry Role

Adult Ministry is any role or activity in which an adult has regular contact with children and youth in the name of the Church.

Examples – Coaches, priests, teachers, volunteers, bus drivers, cooks, etc.

Youth Assistant Role

ASSIST adult ministers in working with children/youth:

Examples – youth counselors, religious education assistants, vacation bible school assistants, etc..

So How Does the Church Protect Our Children/Youth?

“ Let the children come to me and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these”

Luke 18:16

There are several key things the Catholic Church has put into place to help protect our children and youth. They are:

- **Policies and guidelines for those ministering to children/youth.**
- **Required SE training and background**
- **checks for all adults working with children/youth.**
- ***Circle of Grace* safe environment lessons for all youth in the your diocesan schools and parish programs.**

Key Concepts are Taught in *Circle of Grace*

The Goal of the Circle of Grace program is to educate and empower children/youth to actively participate in a safe environment for themselves and others.

God is:

- *“present” in everyone’s Circle of Grace.*
- *“present” because He desires a relationship.*

God Helps us know:

- *what belongs in our Circle of Grace.*
- *what doesn’t belong in our Circle of Grace.*
- *when to ask for help from a trusted adult.*

Youth Assistants Need be Aware of the General *Circle of Grace* Concepts.

Alert the adult leader if:

- **a child or youth talks to you about something “uncomfortable” in his/her *Circle of Grace*.**
- **you witness or hear something that makes you or a child uncomfortable.**
- **you experience something uncomfortable in your *Circle of Grace*.**
